On Thursday 4th July it is the General Elections voting day. All activities will be closed as Greenacre Hall has been a polling station for many years and us moving into the Hall won't change that for the local residents.

AVSED has always taken a non-political stance and, in support of this, we will be closing all activities and the office to allow the elections to take place.



TRANSPORT TEAM NEEDED

Our transport team is an essential part of helping members stay active and independent. We need to grow the team to support our drivers and passenger assistants, and to cover holidays and sicknesses.

Full training is given and there are a variety of ad-hoc and regular roles that we need support with. Can you help?



I am also looking for extra support on our transport team in the form of car drivers.

Using your own vehicle, or volunteering to drive our new WAV, you would compliment the minibus service already in place by picking up members, bringing them to activities and taking them home again at the end. Helping us in this way will allow us to expand the numbers we can support, and also provide a more personal service to those who may find the minibus a little overwhelming, or physically too demanding.



Befriending

As always, my call out for volunteers to become face to face befrienders continues. Befriending is a core service that we offer here at AVSED, and provides support to members who are either temporarily, or permanently in a situation that means they cannot join us at our activities, or, they may need extra social support due to individual circumstances.

The aim of this role is to provide friendship, a listening ear, and a way for someone to feel a part of AVSED even if they cannot physically get to our groups. Members often have various carers or family popping in and out to help with shopping, cleaning, cooking, or personal care but often there is not enough time to simply sit down and have a chat over a cup of tea. Befrienders fill this gap and brighten the day of those that they visit. Visits may include playing games (scrabble, chess, card games), reminiscing, watching and talking about TV, looking through photo albums, going for walks in the community, supporting to join local social groups or whatever is agreed at the start of your pairing. Partnerships may be open ended, short term, or with a specific aim or goal in mind.

CAN YOU:

- Spare an hour a week
- Start conversations
- Listen to others
- Provide social interaction
- Follow Safeguarding and Health and Safety policies
- Follow simple check in and reporting procedures

If so please get in touch with Michelle to discuss further. An enhanced DBS check is required for this role.

Memory Matters Wednesday 1.30 - 4.30

To work alongside our Memory Lead Judith and support members with low level dementia in activities, exercise and shared chats that help stimulate and promote conversation. To help set up and tidy away the activity, prepare drinks and make sure every member gets a warm welcome and goodbye. Volunteering is on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month 1.30 - 4.30.

Fish & Chips

Friday's 11.25 - 12.15 Ad-Hoc

Ad hoc support is always needed to help cover weekly routes. Using your own vehicle to deliver fish and chips to a round of local AVSED members. Collecting from either Springfield Fisheries in Guiseley or the Little Fisherman in Yeadon. We look for volunteers who we can contact for your availability when we have vacancies for cover each week.

Umbrella Club

Friday's 11.00 - 2.30

I need to recruit 2-3 physically able volunteers to help support the set up of the activity including putting up tables and chairs in the activity hall, as well as support in the kitchen on a rota basis providing lunch for our members. Other responsibilities include taking part in the exercise session to encourage and support members who have a diagnosis of dementia or physical impairments and making sure all members have a warm welcome and a supportive experience throughout. Tidying away and breaking down the group at the end of the session also included in the role. Every Friday between 11 and 2.30. DBS and Food Hygiene required.

Car Drivers

Provide help to members and give transport to and from activities or other services in the local area using your own vehicle.

Befrienders

I am constantly on the lookout for more befrienders to provide face to face support to members in their home once a week. To learn more, please get in touch.

Transport Team

Drivers and Passenger Assistants needed to help our members get to and from activities using our Minibuses and Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle (WAV). Full training given.
